## MEMORIAL DAY SERVICE

May 29, 2017 was a perfect day to celebrate Memorial Day at Prospect Hill Cemetery.

## LOT OWNERS MEETING

The 2017 lot owners meeting preceded the Memorial Day Service. Although the 13 lot owners in attendance was an increase from previous years, this did not meet the required 15 for a quorum, and no official business could be transacted. The trustees each presented reports, however.

President Carol Holler opened the meeting and introduced the board members: Edith Gill, Secretary; Rudolph Becker, Treasurer; Eva Brandt, Gerd Halusa, Gerhard Meinzer and Albert Rietz, Trustees.

After a recitation of the pledge of allegiance to the flag of the United States by all in attendance, trustee Halusa offered a reading from the Psalms of David.

Secretary Gill read the minutes of the 2015 Annual Meeting.

Superintendent Connell reported on his activities during the past year

Treasurer Rudy Becker reported on financial activities in 2016. Donations totaled \$ 27,400. A grant of \$11,000 was received from the Phase Foundation for roadway improvements. Investment income totaled \$ 27,000, and other income totaled \$ 27,800. Expenses were \$ 90,100 and net proceeds for the year were (\$ 4,900).

Major expenditures during 2016 included a new mower, preventive tree trimming and storm damage cleanup, insurance, salaries and payroll taxes, and utilities.

## CEMETERY PLOT MARKERS AVAILABLE

Several lot owners suggested that markers be made available to lot owners so that the exact location of their plots could be identified. They felt it would be particularly useful for owners and heirs of owners whose plots are not otherwise marked with headstones, to make the plots easier to find during visits to the cemetery.

The Plot ID number contains the Section ID for the plot, and a map of the cemetery on the website shows the locations of the several sections. Visitors may need to contact the office for the general area within a section where the plot is located.

These markers should be particularly useful for out-of-towners who, knowing the plot number and the area within a section where the plot is located, can visit the cemetery at their own convenience on the days it is open, and find the plot.

## **WATER BILL**

The water and sewer service fees charged by DC Water in 2016 were \$17,000, an increase of \$4,000 or 30% from 2015. They will increase to about 20,000 in 2017 and are expected to increase by about \$3,000 per year for at least the next 5 years. We're not confident that they will ever decline.

The reason for these charges is to pay for the Clean Rivers Project being undertaken by the District of Columbia Water and Sewer Department to comply with federal EPA prohibition of discharges from the city's combined sewer and storm water collection system into area rivers and streams. The discharges result from storm water which falls on impervious areas (roads, sidewalks, parking lots, etc.).

Private, historic cemeteries are particularly hard hit by these charges due to the large quantity of impervious areas they contain and the fact that most of their income is from donations and cemetery lot sales. The normal usages of these funds are for historic preservation. But, with the ever-increasing water and sewer charges, many cemeteries are having to expend perpetual care funds.

To find a solution to this problem, several historic cemeteries including Prospect Hill met in early June 2017 to share experiences and map out a plan of attack for fixing the problem. One solution is to embark on a letter writing campaign in support of legislation aimed at reducing the financial impact of the Clean Rivers Project on historic cemeteries in DC. It is expected that the campaign would be kicked off in late summer/early fall of this year.

## STORM DAMAGE

On the afternoon of July 3, 2017, a thunderstorm blew through DC and across Prospect Hill. A large tree was felled by the resulting high winds. It blocked the main cemetery roadway along the south side above V Street.


